Additionally, 100% of our youth were promoted to the next grade. 99% of our youth showed increased selfconfidence, 99% of our youth avoided derailing behaviors, and 99% of our parents/quardians have met or made progress towards at least one of their goals. Thanks to all of your support, Bigs & Littles NYC Mentoring staff continue to provide customized quidance to our Littles and families navigating the complex and competitive NYC high school and college admissions processes.

W.O.W. PROGRAM

As the 2022-2023 school year came to a close, so did the sixth vear of our World of Work (W.O.W.) Program; a college and career readiness program where high school students are matched with a mentor from a local company. Bigs & Littles has worked with Good Apple since the beginning and were excited to partner with JPMorgan Chase for the second year as well. Our partner companies have been integral to our ability to expose more youth to college and career readiness, using a curriculum that develops 21st century skills such as communication, collaboration. critical thinking and creativity.







The W.O.W. Program continued to cultivate career, academic, and social-emotional skills through informative presentations, group discussions, activities, and personalized time within match pairs. After being matched with a W.O.W. Big for one year,through informative presentations, group discussions, activities, and personalized time within match pairs. After being matched with a W.O.W. Big for one year, 100% of youth served have been promoted to the next grade, all W.O.W. Littles in the program have graduated high school and gone onto college, and 100% of W.O.W. youth avoided derailing behaviors. According to the W.O.W. Bigs & Littles survey results from 2017-2023, 100% of Bigs are glad they became a mentor and would recommend the opportunity to friends at other companies, over 90% of Littles agree that they have developed a better understanding of the workplace and how to apply to college, and 100% of Littles are glad they are in the program.

This year we are thrilled to continue in-person programming events, ensuring our youth and families feel engaged, connected, and empowered. Group offerings aimed at developing academic, social-emotional, and health and wellness life skills and were specially tailored to respond to the needs of our constituents. Youth worked on goal-setting for next year, listened to experiences shared by fellow Littles already enrolled in college and took some time to explore the specific resources their schools have to offer.
